

Bainbridge Island's Oldest Park:

Fay Bainbridge became a State Park in 1944! The state purchased the land from Temple Fay for use as a state park, with the agreement of including Fay in the park name. It has beautiful shoreline access, picnic and bbq areas, a playground, and Bainbridge's only campsites. The park was transferred to the Park District in 2011.



The oldest **Island-managed park** is Rotary Park on Weaver Road followed by Strawberry Hill Park.



Rotary Park was given in 1966 as a founding gift to the Island's new Park District by Rotary Club of Bainbridge Island. It is now the home of Bainbridge Island Little League and the new Owen's Playground.

Strawberry Hill Park was turned over to the new Park District by the Federal Government in 1967. It is now the home of the Park District main offices as well as many recreational facilities including a dog park, softball and football fields, a skate park and playground.



Bainbridge Island's Newest Park:

Sakai Park is our newest park! In 2015 voters approved a bond measure allowing the Park District to purchase the property for a centrally located park. After a process of community input, the Park District is just beginning the work to transform this parcel into a more useable park space.
